#### **Context Statement**

Magill School caters for students from R-6. At the time of this report, the enrolment in 2023 is 765. Magill School is classified as Category 7 on the Department for Education Index of Educational Disadvantage. At the time of this report, the school population includes 1% Aboriginal students, 3% students with disabilities, 35% students with English as an additional language or dialect (EALD) funded background. ## **Governing Council Report**

The Magill School Governing Council continues to maintain a high level of interest and input into many aspects of school governance through its consultation and decision-making processes. The Governing Council works with the school to involve the local community, to develop and approve school policies, set the broad vision of the site, monitor and review the site improvement plan and we are also the employing authority of the OSHC.

At every meeting, we have reviewed, discussed and accepted the schools and OSHC's financial reports which include the budgets, variance reports, balance sheets and profit and loss statements.

Members of Governing Council participated in giving feedback to The Department for Education's External School Review.

During 2023, the Governing Council also voted that the OSHC contribute funds to the upgrade of our school's IT infrastructure.

Our parent engagement committee held several successful workshops for parents and their children. The committee has plans to continue these workshops again this year.

Our fundraising committee held many successful events in 2023, raising over \$26,000 for our school! We are thrilled to have a calendar full of events again this year – including the return of our adults-only quiz night!

The OSHC committee supported the OSHC through budgeting challenges and staffing changes that included the appointment of a new assistant director.

The Governing Council also continued participating in numerous and extensive discussions around the junior primary building project and the playground funding. We were incredibly proud to see the new building handed over to the teachers and their classes after the Term 2 holidays!

The Governing Council will continue discussions around the nature playground planned for the area outside of the new build – something I've been particularly passionate about.

I congratulate the staff, students and parents for a great 2023 and look forward to a successful 2024.



## **NAPLAN Proficiency**

In 2023, the Australian Curriculum, Assessment and Reporting Authority (ACARA) - a Commonwealth Independent statutory authority - announced changes to NAPLAN performance reporting. This new way of reporting by ACARA that NAPLAN results from 2023 will not be comparable to previous years. The new approach replaces the previous numerical NAPLAN bands and the national minimum standard.









#### **Attendance Comment**

In South Australia, all children and young people must be in school from 6 years to 16 years old. They must attend a government or non-government school full time. From age 16 to 17 however, young people must attend school or an approved learning program (such as an apprenticeship, traineeship, accredited course or university). Schools and parents must encourage and support students to come to school every day. Parents and caregivers must make sure their child is enrolled in a school, and attends school all day and everyday it is open, unless a child is sick or has an approved exemption. Teachers and leaders actively follow up when a student misses school, including recording all absences and non-attendance. All schools in South Australia have local attendance procedures governed under the Education and Children's Services Regulations 2020.
